To empower students through rights-based education and hands-on learning.

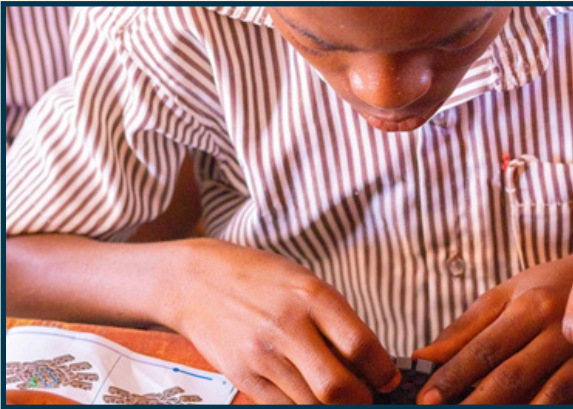
Where We Worked :

6 Schools Reached in the Upper East Region

ACTIVITY	DETAILS	KEY THEMES
Child Rights Training	<p>We ran training sessions at Siniensi and Alab Yeri Junior High Schools.</p> <p>A total of 64 students took part — girls and boys.</p>	Empowerment, Protection, Responsibility
LEGO Workshops	<p>We visited five schools to run fun, hands-on LEGO sessions. 120 students joined in to build, solve problems, and work in teams.</p>	Creativity, Problem-Solving, Teamwork
Sanitary Pad Distribution	<p>We gave out sanitary pads to 114 girls at Siniensi and Alab Yeri Junior High Schools. This helps girls stay in school and feel comfortable.</p> <p>In total, we gave out 258 pads during the quarter.</p>	Menstrual Hygiene, Dignity, Class Participation

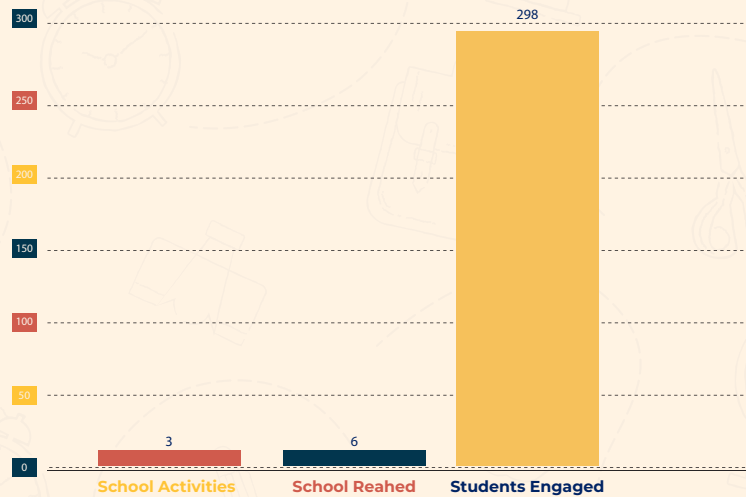

IMPACT AT A GLANCE :

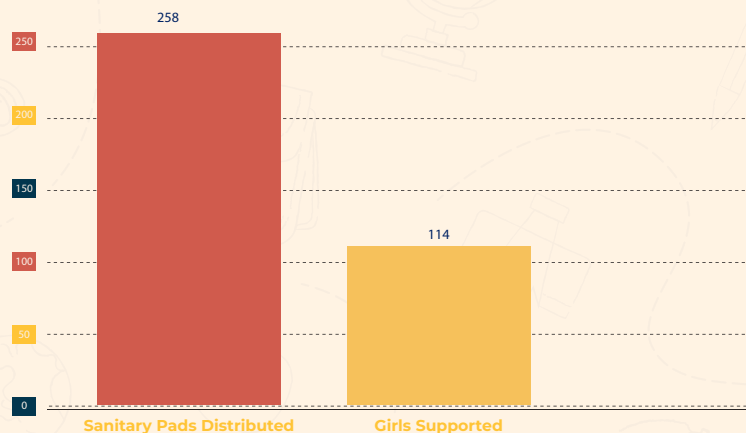
3 school activities conducted

CHALLENGES & RESPONSE :

- Problem:**
 We had delays giving out sanitary pads because our usual brand was not available in local shops.
- What We Did:**
 We found another good-quality brand nearby and told the schools right away. This helped us avoid big delays and keep trust with the students and teachers.

Goal: To help students learn outside the classroom and experience new places and ideas.

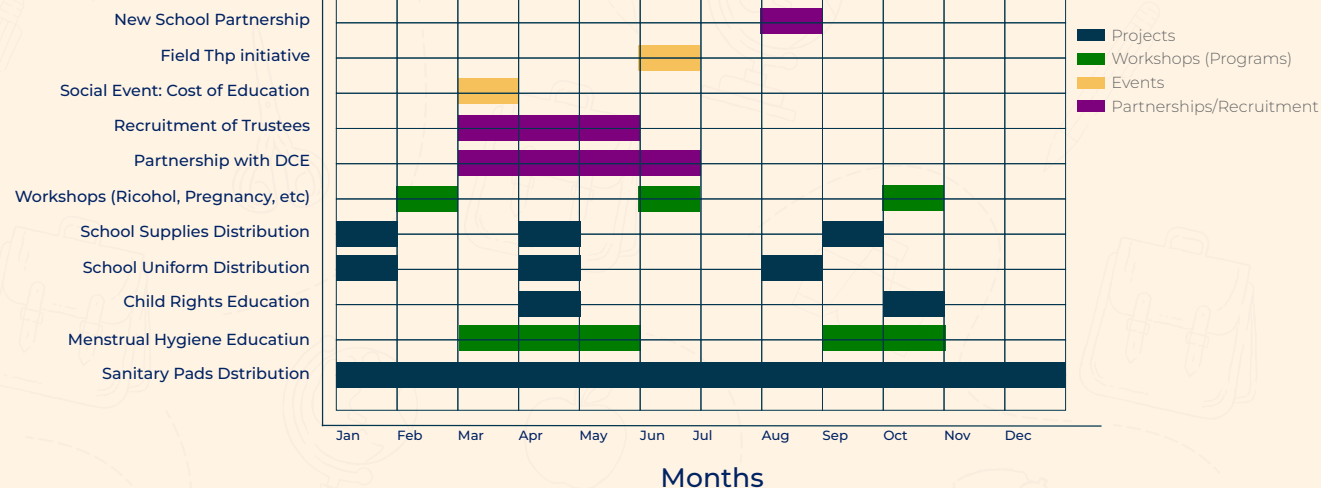
• School Renovation
